


How do I know if someone needs a Working With Children Check Card?

Is the person working or volunteering with children at a playgroup session or event?

WWC legislation defines child-related work "is when the usual duties of the person's role involve, or are likely to involve contact with a child or children in connection with one of the 18 prescribed categories of child-related work" ([click here for information on child-related work](#))



Examples:

1. A playgroup **parent** is volunteering at a playgroup event (eg open day) to run a children's craft activity. Parent volunteer exemption applies, **NO** WWCC Required. Parents only required to complete voluntary declaration.
2. A playgroup is having an event where there will be **food trucks** present serving food. No WWCC required for food truck operators, however Voluntary Declaration required.
3. A playgroup is having an event and there is a **face painting business** attending. Face Painters **REQUIRE** WWCC, as they are working directly with the children.
4. A playgroup has **volunteers** who come to playgroup sessions, help with crafts, coffee, tea etc. Volunteers **REQUIRE** WWCC, as they are working directly with the children.
5. A playgroup has a **gardener** who only attends playgroup when no children are present. WWCC Not required.
6. A **grandparent** attends playgroup with their grandchild as a participant (they are not working or volunteering), WWCC not required.
